Long Term Treatment of an Autistic Child

PRESENTATION: (*INSTRUCTIONAL LEVEL: INTERMEDIATE*) The treatment of the child began as part of a project directed by Margaret Mahler and Manuel Furer at the Master's Children Center in New York. The child had no language and was extremely wild and disorganized but it was always clear that she was very gifted and intelligent. The treatment focused on mother and child together to help not only the child but also the mother's ability to tolerate the severity of her daughter's illness. She left home as a teenager, married an Indonesian man and gave birth to two children, during which time, therapy continued by correspondence. When she returned to New York with her children, regular treatment resumed on a three times a week basis. Dr. Bergmann's presentation will discuss the treatment and illustrate some aspects of the therapeutic process with recorded vignettes from sessions. Dr. Bergmann continues to see the patient and will fully describe how the patient functions presently as an adult, an artist and a mother of two grown children. "*The patient is and always has been fully dedicated to her children, who play an important part in her recovery from her autistic past.*"

PRESENTER: [Anni Bergman, Ph.D.](#) is an adult and child psychoanalyst, a mother-infant therapist and a mother-toddler therapist. She is a Faculty Member of the NYU Postdoctoral Program in Psychotherapy and Psychoanalysis, a Training and Supervising Analyst at the Institute for Psychoanalytic Training and Research (IPTAR) and the New York Freudian Society, a Clinical Professor at the City University of New York (CUNY), a member of the W. A. White Psychoanalytic Society and the IPA. Dr. Bergman developed a program to teach therapists mother-infant and mother-toddler therapy, The Anni Bergman Parent Infant Training Program of New York Freudian Society and IPTAR. She was a pioneer in research and treatment of mothers and infants, and mothers and toddlers and author of the 1975 groundbreaking book, along with Margaret Mahler and Fred Pine, *The Psychological Birth of the Human Infant*. In addition to her many scholarly and media papers and presentations, Dr. Bergman is the author along with Manuel Fahey of the 1999 book, *Ours, Yours, Mine: Mutuality and the Emergence of the Separate Self*. In 1997 she was awarded the Margaret S. Mahler Psychiatric Research Foundation Literature Prize.
