THE PRESENTATION

INSTRUCTIONAL LEVEL: INTERMEDIATE

Dr. Jean Petrucelli will present an approach to the treatment of anorexia, bulimia and binge eating disorder beyond symptom alleviation with the initial phase involving direct symptom intervention within the framework of an interpersonally based analytic treatment. With an eye towards understanding the neurobiological underpinnings and the implications of these findings in treatment, the concepts of attachment theory, self regulation and affect regulation will be viewed as interpersonal constructs. Cultural influence, etiology, clinical conundrums, countertransference reactions, roadblocks and treatment goals will be considered in developing an understanding of how to reach these often "unreachable" patients. Issues related to body obsession, diagnosis, assessing the level of care, appetite, creating contracts and food charts will be presented as part of the bridge one builds to enter the ritual-filled world of the eating disordered patient. Eating disorder patients notice so much about bodies and convey so much by talking and also *not-talking* about bodies. Dr. Jean Petrucelli will explore how she uses bodily transference and countertransference to bring split-off aspects of her eating disordered patients into the room by inviting reactions to her clothes, body and bodily occasional failings. Her aim is to welcome bodies into the therapeutic dialogue. Lastly, case material will be presented where the role of secrets and desire can create double lives that will only be revealed when they are truly ready to be known.

THE PRESENTER

Jean Petrucelli, Ph.D. is Director & Co-Founder of the Eating Disorders, Compulsions & Addictions Service, Fellow, Supervising Analyst, Teaching Faculty and Founding Director of the Eating Disorders, Compulsions & Addictions one year educational certificate program at the William Alanson White Institute; Teaching Faculty at NYU Postdoctoral Program in Psychotherapy and Psychoanalysis and Associate Editor for the journal *Contemporary Psychoanalysis*. She is Editor of the books *Knowing, Not-Knowing & Sort-of-Knowing: Psychoanalysis and the Experience of Uncertainty* (Karnac Books, 2010); *Longing: Psychoanalytic Musings on Desire* (Karnac Books, 2006); Co-Editor of the book *Hungers & Compulsions: The Psychodynamic Treatment of Eating Disorders and Addictions* (Jason Aronson Inc., 2001); 2008 Co-Chair of the American Psychological Association's Division 39 NY spring conference; member of The Body Group with Susie Orbach, The Woman's Therapy Center and The New School conducting research on the Intergenerational Transmission of Body Image Issues. Dr. Petrucelli specializes in the interpersonal treatment of eating disorders and addictions and has lectured at universities, private and public high schools, and treatment facilities. She is a psychoanalyst in private practice on the upper Westside in New York City.

THE LEARNING OBJECTIVES

After attending this program in full, participants will be able to:

1. Utilize interpersonal perspectives in the treatment of anorexia, bulimia and binge eating disorders.
2. Conceptualize eating disordered patients' capacities to self soothe and regulate internal experience, then work more effectively with the relational component of the eating disorder as it plays out in treatment and in the world.
3. Describe the concept of dissociation and at least one dimension of the theory related to its use in clinical work with ED patients.
4. Conceptualize how disordered eating is the psychic inability to care for one's self and to make better clinical use of this perspective through the contexts of attachment, self state theory, self regulation and affect regulation issues.
5. Effectively apply action oriented techniques to enhance clinical treatment with eating disordered patients.
6. Articulate a conceptualization of the role of secrets and its relationship to desire and how this is manifested in split off parts of the self.
