- Panel proposals should include an abstract for each participant.
- Abstracts should include the author's name and institutional affiliation.
- All submissions addressing the broad conference theme, "Thinking with Erich Fromm Today," will be considered.
- Abstracts should be submitted as either a Word or PDF file.

Acceptance decisions will be made by: May 1, 2024
